FAFSA Free Application for Federal Student Aid- (AVAILABLE 10/1/17)

- The FAFSA is the form used by all two- and four-year colleges, universities and career schools for the awarding of federal student aid and most state and college aid. Students should apply as soon as possible online via www.fafsa.gov.
- Sign up for your **Federal Student Aid ID # NOW! Both Students and Parents need to have an FSA ID.** Visit www.fsaaid.ed.gov to do so.

➤ **FAFSA WORKSHOP – Project Excel**

- **NYS residency eligibility requirement** for recipients of awards administered by HESC is waived for a member of or spouse or dependent of a member of the USAF who is on full-time active duty and stationed in New York State. For additional information visit www.hesc.ny.gov
- **NYS STEM Incentive Program**
Provides full SUNY or CUNY tuition scholarship for top 10 percent of NYS high school students if pursuing STEM degree and work in a STEM field in NYS for 5 years. For additional information visit www.hesc.ny.gov
- **NYS Math & Science Teaching Incentive Scholarship**
Offered for students to pursue careers in secondary math and science teachers. For more information visit www.hesc.ny.gov
- **NYS Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant**
Grants up to \$4,000.00 per year to students in exchange for service at public or private elementary or secondary schools that serve students from low-income families. For more information visit www.hesc.ny.gov
- **NYS Tuition Assistance Program (TAP)**
Helps eligible NY residents pay tuition at approved schools in NYS. Annual TAP awards can be up to \$5,165.00. Because TAP is a grant – it does not have to be paid back. For additional information visit www.hesc.ny.gov
- **NYS Excelsior Scholarship**
The program covers tuition for eligible SUNY and CUNY students. The program will be phased in over three years, beginning in Fall 2017. It would first apply to families who earn \$100,000 or less, then to those who earn \$110,000 or less in 2018, and eventually reaching \$125,000 or less in 2019. ➤ **NYS Enhanced Tuition Award**

This program enables NY students attending private not-for-profit colleges in NY to receive financial assistance to complete their college degree. The program provides a maximum award of \$3,000, requires private colleges to provide a match and freeze student tuition for the duration of the award – maximizing the financial benefit to the student.
