PRUDENTIAL SPIRIT OF COMMUNITY AWARDS for *students* in grades 9-12 who have taken part in community service activities over the past year. Once the form is completed online, it must be printed out, signed and submitted to Ms. Bonilla in Guidance West by OCTOBER 31st. Huntington High School can only nominate one student who has demonstrated exemplary volunteerism.

V.F.W. VOICE OF DEMOCRACY SCHOLARSHIP open to all students in *grades 9-12* is an audio-essay contest leading to a national winner of a \$30,000 scholarship. SCHOLARSHIPS FOR SENIORS

AXA ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIPS of up to \$25,000 is administered by Scholarship America. Primary consideration will be given to the applicant's non-academic outstanding achievement in school, community, or workplace. Other school and community activities, work experience, and academic records will be considered. Only 10,000 applications will be reviewed so please apply early. Apply at https://www.scholarsapply.org/axa-achievement/. **DEADLINE IS DECEMBER 15th**.

COCA COLA SCHOLARS PROGRAM for seniors with highly developed interests in their community, demonstrated leadership, academic achievement (minimum GPA of 3.0), commitment to community and employment. 200 stipends are awarded annually across four tiers of recipients in varying amounts: Fifty New Century Gold Scholars are awarded \$1,500, fifty Silver Scholars are awarded \$1,250, and fifty Bronze Scholars are awarded \$1,000. This program is available to U.S. Citizens; U.S. Nationals; U.S. Permanent Residents; Refugees; Asylees; Cuban-Haitian Entrants; or Humanitarian Parolees. Applications must be submitted online at www.coca-colascholars.org. **DEADLINE IS** OCTOBER 31st.

COLGATE-PALMOLIVE & HISPANIC SCHOLARSHIP FUND's "MAKE THE U" SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM will award 31 scholarships. Ten \$2,000 grants, ten \$3,000, ten \$3,500 and one \$15,000 grand prize. Three short essays required. Application information is available at www.colgate.com/HazLaU. Graduating seniors of Hispanic descent, who are United States citizens or legal permanent residents, have a minimum GPA of 3.0/4.0, and are planning to attend college full-time upon graduation are eligible to apply. **DEADLINE IS OCTOBER** 15th.

ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION MOST VALUABLE STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP CONTEST is open to seniors who are United States citizens and are planning to earn a four-year college degree. HORATIO ALGER ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIPS for graduating seniors who have demonstrated integrity, perseverance in overcoming adversity, strength of character, substantial financial need, a good academic record, commitment to pursuing a college education, and a desire to contribute to society. Students will need to answer the following question in 750 words or less: With more people taking on student debt to pay for college and record high default rates, what do you think can be done to improve the financial literacy of our nation's young adults to help this problem? RON BROWN SCHOLARS PROGRAM offers awards to academically talented, highly motivated African American seniors who plan to pursue undergraduate degrees full-time. Students must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents. Up to twenty students will be selected nationwide to receive \$10,000 for each of four years. Applicants should demonstrate academic achievement, exhibit leadership ability, participate in community service activities and demonstrate financial need. SUFFOLK ACADEMY OF MEDICINE "DOCTORS OF TOMORROW" PROGRAM for graduating seniors interested in entering the field of medicine.
