

### STUDENT/PARENT PORTALS

- Log onto the Huntington School District's Website at <u>www.hufsd.edu</u>.
- On the QuickClicks menu on the top right, click 'For Parents' or 'For Students' respectively, and then Parent-Portal or Student-Portal.
- For Parents, click on "Online Registration", then enter the School District name and create your account. You will need your child's 9 digit identification number.
- For students, enter your nine digit identification number and then for your password, you will enter the word, 'guidance'. Shortly thereafter, you will be prompted to create a unique password.
- The Eschool Mobile App is available for parents only (Android and Apple phones). Download eSchoolData. Parents will need to enter their email address (as it appears in eschool) and portal password.

## NCAA CLEARINGHOUSE



- All student-athletes planning to participate in Division I or Division II sports MUST register with the clearinghouse after the *completion* of junior year (following the sixth semester), or at the *start* of senior year (September).
- To register, students MUST file online at <u>www.eligibilitycenter.org</u>. Print out the NCAA Records Release Form and submit to Ms. Klein in Central Guidance.
- Review credit counts and core conversion units with your school counselor and/or log onto <a href="http://corecoursegpa.com">http://corecoursegpa.com</a>.
