THE ARCHITECTS FOUNDATION awards thousands of dollars in architecture scholarships to high school students, architecture students in NAAB-accredited undergraduate and graduate degree programs, as well as Architect Registration Exam (ARE) candidates who are working toward becoming licensed architects. A multiyear scholarship of up to \$20,000 supports high school and undergraduate minority students. Students must visit <u>https://www.architectsfoundation.org</u> and click "What we do" to apply. Deadline is JANUARY 16th.

THE B. DAVIS SCHOLARSHIP of \$1,000 is available to all high school juniors and seniors. This is not an academic scholarship, but they still want to know students' future academic plans. BANK OF AMERICA STUDENT LEADERS PROGRAM is an eightweek summer experience for high school juniors and seniors. It includes a paid internship with a local nonprofit organization, as well as the Student Leadership Summit in Washington, D.C. Students must be in good academic standing to be considered. Deadline is FEBRUARY 1st. **THE CUNY BECAS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM** of the Jaime Lucero Mexican Studies Institute offers scholarships of up to \$6,730 to CUNY undergraduate and graduate students who meet three criteria: academic achievement, financial need, and commitment to service in the Mexican and/or immigrant community. The selection committee does not discriminate based on immigration status, race, gender, age, ethnicity, or national origin. THE DR. JONG PIL LEE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP will be

awarded by The Long Island Mathematics Conference Board. Up to four \$1,500 scholarships will be allocated to deserving students from Queens, Brooklyn, Nassau and Suffolk Counties, of African American, Native American or Non-European Hispanic American decent. These students must plan to major in mathematics at an accredited college or university of their choice. Candidates should address their love of mathematics in their personal essay and indicate the reasons why they should receive this scholarship. Only high school seniors are eligible for this award. \$2,500 is available to graduating seniors who reside with a parent or guardian who is a survivor of breast cancer or other women's cancer, or who resides with a parent or guardian who has passed away from breast cancer or other women's cancer. MARIA A. SCIARA SCHOLARSHIP of \$2,000 is available to students who reside or have resided with a parent or guardian who is a survivor of any cancer other than breast cancer and/or other women's cancers; or have resided with a parent or guardian who has passed from any cancer other than breast cancer and/or other women's cancers. Those aspiring to become teachers will be given extra consideration for this scholarship but pursuing an education to become an educator IS NOT required to apply. NATIONAL CO-OP SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM will award up to 160 merit co-op scholarships for a total value of \$4,200,000 to students attending one of their partner institutions. Minimum GPA of 3.5 is required. Apply at <u>http://www.waceinc.org/scholarship/</u>. Deadlines are as early as JANUARY 15th.
