2019 OUR SPIRIT OF ANNE FRANK SCHOLARSHIP AWARD is offered to high school seniors who have proven themselves as exceptional leaders in combating intolerance, prejudice and injustice in their communities. An essay and two letters of recommendations are needed. Students need to apply online at <http://annefrank.com/scholarships>. Deadline is February 28th.

THE 2019 ROSEN & OHR SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM is accepting essays from students who have suffered injuries due to an accident or who have been impacted personally by a loved one's accident. Student must visit <https://www.rosenohrlaw.com/scholarship/> for more information. Deadline is July 20th.

2019 STUDENT-VIEW SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM is offering thirteen scholarships between \$500 to \$4,000 to high school seniors who log on to www.student-view.com and complete a 15-20 minute application survey about colleges in your area. No essay, SAT/ACT scores, or fees required. Deadline is April 22nd.

ADVENTURELAND'S HELPING HANDS FOUNDATION is now accepting applications for the Tony Gentile Memorial Scholarship. Students must be seniors who plan to attend a Long Island college or university full-time in the fall. Five \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded. Students should log onto <http://www.helpinghandsli.org/> and click on Scholarship Fund to apply. Applications must be postmarked by May 10th.

BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL is offering the Anthony J. Stupore Memorial Scout Scholarship, a renewable \$1,000 scholarship. Candidates must be a registered Boy Scout, Venturer, or Explorer, submit a written statement, and two letters of recommendation. Interested students must see Ms. Bonilla in Guidance West. Deadline is May 1st.

BP COMMUNITY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM is available to seniors who are planning to attend a two or four-year college and can demonstrate financial need. Interested students are invited to apply online at www.bpscholarships.com. Scholarship applications must be submitted online by March 22nd.

THE CAMILLA G. BELSER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND offers a \$2,500 annual renewable scholarship to a student who will be attending Nassau or Suffolk Community College (other two-year colleges will be considered). Candidates must submit an essay with their application, a resume, and two letters of recommendation. Interested students must see Ms. Bonilla in Guidance West. Deadline is April 19th.

THE DREAMS FOR YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM provides financial support so Long Island youth can pursue their dreams and aspirations. Their academic scholarship ranging from \$1,000 to \$5,000 is available to seniors and assists with costs at a college, university, private or vocational school. Applicants must demonstrate financial need and a commitment to community service. Interested students must apply at <http://www.unitedwayli.org/dreamsforyouth>. Deadline is April 19th.

THE FIRE FIGHTER PATRICK O'KEEFE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP offers an \$8,000 grant award paid over four years to any United States citizen who is an immigrant or child of an immigrant OR a student who has lost a parent to an act of violence. There are no academic requirements; students must simply be able to tell their stories. Interested students must see Ms. Bonilla in Guidance West for an application. Deadline is March 15th.

GREATER LONG ISLAND RUNNING CLUB 2019 HERB GRAYSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP of \$2,000 will be awarded to one or more graduating Nassau or Suffolk County High School seniors chosen on the basis of involvement in and service to the Long Island running community. Interested students must see Ms. Bonilla in Guidance West for an application. Deadline is April 3rd.

THE HONORABLE PETER FOX COHALAN SCHOLARSHIP IN AMERICAN HISTORY is awarded to a graduating Suffolk County high school senior who will pursue an undergraduate degree with a concentrated study of a minimum of 24 credit hours in American History and/or American Government. The scholarship award is \$10,000 per year for up to four years of degree completion. Only 3 students per high school can apply. Please see Ms. Bonilla in Guidance West with intent to apply. ****THE HUNTINGTON MARINE CORPS** is offering two scholarships of up to \$2,000 to qualifying students who are related to a former marine. Candidates must plan on attending a college/university upon graduation and submit an essay. Please see Ms. Bonilla in Guidance West if interested. Deadline is May 1st.

****THE HUNTINGTON YOUTH BUREAU YOUTH DEVELOPMENT RESEARCH INSTITUTE** presents the Donald A. Pius Scholarship for the Town of Huntington seniors in pursuit of their college and/or vocational trade education. Five \$2,000 scholarships are available. Criteria includes: financial need, academic performance, community service, family responsibility, and/or extracurricular activities. Students must stop into Ms. Bonilla in Guidance West for an application and to obtain additional information such as income limits. Deadline is April 19th.

ISLAND FEDERAL CREDIT UNION will award eleven high school seniors scholarships of \$2,500 - \$10,000. Eligible students must be accepted into a full-time undergraduate program at the time of entry and hold an Island checking/debit card account. Print out and complete the Scholarship Entry Form at <https://www.islandfcu.org/Island-Scholarship.aspx>. Deadline is April 19th.

JULIE PEIERLS SCHOLARSHIP, sponsored by Theatre Three, in the amount of \$1,000, will be presented to a Long Island senior planning to pursue a career in professional theatre, as well as pursue theatrical education at a college as a musical theatre major or at a conservatory. Completed application, audition, and interview are required. Applications are available at www.theatrethree.com. Deadline is June 1st.

LAW OFFICE OF COHEN AND JAFFE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM is designed to help high school seniors who are interested in attending an institution of higher education upon graduating from high school. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent U.S. residents, and be accepted to an institution of higher learning. One applicant will be awarded \$1,000, one runner-up will be awarded \$500, and three applicants will be awarded \$250 as honorable mentions. Students should log onto <https://www.cohenjaffe.com/college-scholarship/> for further information and to complete their application. Deadline is April 5th.

LONG ISLAND FAIR SCHOLARSHIPS will award up to ten \$1,000 scholarships to New York high school seniors and current college students. The application is open to all applicants regardless of field of study, however, additional consideration may be given to those pursuing a degree related to agriculture, fair management or the outdoor amusement business. Applications must be downloaded from www.nyfairs.org/scholarship.htm. Completed applications must be printed and signed by the applicant and parent/guardian. Application, with required attachments, must be sent together to local Member fair or to the NYSSA for endorsement. Deadline is April 12th.

LONG ISLAND UNIVERSITY'S HOPE SCHOLARS PROGRAM provides students with career and internship connections, study abroad opportunities, research collaboration, personal mentorship, enrichment activities, community engagement, and full tuition through LIU scholarships and state/federal financial aid. Students must meet entrance guidelines of 1100 on the SAT's, 90 GPA, EFC of 0, and be a NY resident. Students can apply to the program at www.liu.edu/hope. Deadline is TBD.

NEFCU'S FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP is a \$3,000 scholarship awarded to high school seniors. Eligible seniors must complete an essay, provide proof of 50 community service hours, participate in 3 extracurricular activities and/or sports, and be a NEFCU member. Interested students should visit <https://www.mynefcu.org/scholarships-grants> to apply. Family Scholarship applicants will be eligible to apply for NEFCU's Premier Scholarship which awards one \$50,000 scholarship paid out over four years. Deadline is May 1st.

NEW YORK SCHOOLS INSURANCE RECIPROCAL announces the following scholarships which will award winners up to \$5,000:

The Bambino Scholarship is available to a special education student who is college bound. The goal of this scholarship is to reward a student who has worked through his/her special challenges to complete high school and gain acceptance into a college or university.

The Jensen Scholarship is available to a student who has excelled in design in his or her high school career. The goal of this scholarship is to reward a student who has shown interest and promise in design and who wishes to pursue this path in college.

The Goncalves Scholarship is available to a student who demonstrates an involvement and work for a cause or organization that promotes social justice, equal opportunity, relief of human suffering; or other aspiration generally understood to be within the meaning of humanitarian activity throughout his/her high school career.

Interested students must see Ms. Bonilla in Guidance West for the applications and return all needed materials by March 29th.

NYS SOCIETY OF CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANTS, Suffolk Chapter offers several awards of up to \$2,500 to seniors with a minimum GPA of 3.5, SAT of 1200 or ACT of 28, proof of acceptance as a full-time student to a New York college or university for accounting, and demonstrate financial need. See Ms. Bonilla in Guidance West for applications. Deadline is April 1st.

THE REA JACOBS SCHOLARSHIP FOR DANCE is a competitive scholarship for Nassau and Suffolk High School Graduating Seniors who are pursuing a four year college degree with a major or minor in Dance. One award of \$1000 will be given in 2019 to a male or female student. The scholarship is funded by the Long Island Dance Consortium and the Jacobs Family. SANDI BLOOMBERG SCHOLARSHIP FOR DANCE will award one Long Island senior a \$1,000 scholarship for continuing the study of dance in college. Interested students should visit <http://www.huntingtonarts.org/programs/arts-in-education/scholarship-programs/> for an application. Deadline for receipt of required portfolio is May 3rd.

THE SUFFOLK COUNTY ATHLETIC TRAINERS' ASSOCIATION (SCATA) will award up to three scholarships, each valued at \$1,000, to graduating high school seniors accepted into CAATE-accredited athletic training programs. Interested students should visit <http://scatassoc.weebly.com/>. Deadline is May 1st.

SUFFOLK COUNTY BAR ASSOCIATION is offering a \$1,000 scholarship based on the academic transcript, school/community involvement and an essay on an issue of social concern. See Ms. Bonilla in Guidance West for an application. Deadline is March 29th.

Tzu Chi USA Scholars are selected on the basis of their financial need, academic achievement, and community involvement. Each Scholar will receive an award of \$1,000. VIRGINIA W. SMITH SCHOLARSHIP of \$2,500 is available to one Long Island senior who plans to further his/her education by majoring in horticulture, environment, or conservation studies. An interview is required. Students can access the application at <http://ncgc.org>. Deadline is April 30th.

CONTESTS & PROGRAMS FOR ALL GRADES

THE ABBOTT & FENNER SCHOLARSHIP of \$1,000 is available to all high school juniors and seniors. An essay describing educational career and life goals must be submitted. Interested students should visit <http://www.abbottandfenner.com/scholarships.htm>. Deadline is June 14th.

CAMINOS AL FUTURO is a fully-funded summer scholarship program that engages high-achieving juniors (rising seniors) from U.S. high schools in a residential academic leadership development program at the George Washington University. Interested students should visit <https://cisneros.columbian.gwu.edu/apply-caminos-al-futuro-program>. Deadline is March 1st.

COLLEGEBOARD OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIPS is a new scholarship program with \$5 million of scholarships each year, beginning with the class of 2020. The more effort you put in, the more opportunities you have to earn a scholarship. Complete all six, and you're eligible to earn \$40,000. Scholarships will be awarded through monthly drawings to students who complete each action, i.e. building your college list. THE DREAMS FOR YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM provides financial support so Long Island youth can pursue their dreams and aspirations. Their enrichment scholarship ranging from \$100 to \$2,500 is available to students in grades 7-12 and assists with costs associated with activities that enrich mind, body, and spirit. Examples may include music, singing, dance, art lessons, computer graphics training, acting, photography, fashion design and specialized summer camps, etc. Funds may be used for enrollment fees and/or supplies. Applicants must demonstrate financial need and a commitment to community service. Interested students must apply at <http://www.unitedwayli.org/dreamsforyouth>. Deadline is April 19th.

HIGH SCHOOL RESEARCH PROGRAM is a highly competitive, six week educational program where students work alongside Brookhaven National Laboratory scientific staff. Transportation and housing is not provided. Recommended for students who completed 11th grade and must be at least 15 years of age. For complete rules and application process, please visit www.bnl.gov/education, click on Students and then Programs & Contests. Registration closes on March 22nd.

JACOBSON INSTITUTE FOR YOUTH ENTREPRENEURSHIP AT THE UNIVERSITY OF IOWA is hosting a BizInnovator Competition for high school students in grades 9-12 with business ideas. A business background is not needed to compete. Students must log onto <https://bizinnovator.com/> and click on “Competition” to apply and learn more. Online applications must be submitted by April 25th.

THE JOAN ABOFF MEMORIAL ART SCHOLARSHIP is a competitive visual arts scholarship to Usdan; Summer Camp for the Arts for 11th and 12th grade students in the town of Huntington. Interested students should visit <http://www.huntingtonarts.org/programs/arts-in-education/scholarship-programs/> for an application. Deadline for receipt of required portfolio is March 1st.
