Attendance/Absence

Attendance is essential for successful learning. However, students should not come to school if they are sick. The school nurse will provide care to a student who becomes sick in school. The nurse's function is not to diagnose children who come to school sick. So please use good judgement when sending your child to school. Additionally please remember to keep your emergency card updated so that you can be contacted in case of an emergency.

If your child is going to be absent, please call 673-2141 in the morning to leave a message regarding the absence. Students must bring an absence note to school on the day that they return. Absences will be recorded as either legal or illegal.

Health Services

The Health office at Jefferson is open for first aid, immediate treatment for all members of the school. It is staffed by a full-time Registered Nurse that conducts vision, hearing and health screenings throughout the school year and keeps a cumulative health record of each student. The nurse can also administer any medically necessary medication or treatment to a student while in school with the appropriate order from a doctor. Students must be fever-free, have not vomited or had diarrhea for 24 hours before sending them back to school. If your child has a diagnosis of flu, strep, pink eye, etc., please call the nurse. If you have any questions or concerns you can contact Nurse Ilona at 673-2141.

Cafeteria

Our cafeteria serves breakfast and lunch daily. Meal tickets can be purchased by check (made out to Huntington School Lunch Fund) or you can open a Nutrikids account for your child by going to the website www.myschoolbucks.com. Depositing money into your child's account through the website allows you to check on your child's balance.

In the event that your child has a severe peanut allergy, we will have a peanut free table in the student cafeteria. Please be sure to notify the school nurse.

Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

The school doors open at 9:05 am. Children should not arrive at school before this time, as there is no adult supervision. When dropping students off, please pull into the parking lot and park on the right hand side by the drop-off sign adjacent the sidewalk. Students will be escorted by school personnel from 9:05 am to 9:20 am. Students will lineup in the gymnasium and will be escorted to their respective classrooms by school personnel at 9:20 am.

School starts at 9:20 am. It is essential that children come to school on time and stay in school the entire day in order to learn all that is expected. If your child does arrive after 9:20 am, your child will be considered late. Parents will then be required to come inside to sign-in at the front desk.

Walkers are dismissed at 3:25 pm from the cafeteria door. Please be prompt when picking up your child. Please remember to sign-out your child at dismissal time. Always bring photo ID when picking up your child. It helps to relieve congestion, both inside and outside of the building, when you quickly pick up your child and leave.

If a student who usually takes the bus needs to be picked up, please send in a note in the morning. Please remember to include the name of the person picking up your child (if it is not a parent). This helps teachers get students ready to be dismissed and will ease dismissal procedures. Calling during the day should be a last resort. If we do not receive a note from a parent or guardian, we must put a child on his/her regular bus.

School Closings/Delays

Inclement weather may affect the opening of schools. Under severe weather conditions, it may be necessary to close schools. At other times, rather than close schools for the entire day, the Superintendent may decide to have a delayed opening. The operation of the delayed opening plan entails the following:

- Each school will open one or two hours later than the regular opening time.
- Buses will pick up students one or two hours later than their regular time
- Dismissal times <u>will not</u> be affected by delayed openings.

Whether schools are closed or openings are delayed due to inclement weather, the announcements will be made over News 12 (Cable TV), Connect Ed message, and the following radio stations: WBLI/FM 106.1 & Walk/FM 97.5

Homework

The Jefferson faculty is committed to assigning homework that enhances and extends the school learning experience. Homework can develop good study skills and reinforce skills learned during the school day by practice and repetition. Additionally, homework establishes a connection between the home and school learning environments and develops a sense of confidence and responsibility for students.

Student Homework Responsibilities:

- To know their homework assignments and, in the upper grades, to write down their homework in an assignment book
- To ask questions if they do not understand the assignments
- To bring home necessary materials
- To put forth their best effort showing pride in their work

Parent/Guardian Responsibilities:

- To encourage their child to do their best work independently when possible and to provide support when necessary
- To contact the teacher if their child is experiencing consistent frustration with assignments

Fluency Practice:

In addition to assigned homework, it is necessary for students to practice their fluency in both mathematics and reading daily. When a student has fluent skills, they respond correctly, automatically, and with ease.

To Increase Reading Fluency:

- Students must read or be read to for a minimum of twenty minutes daily at home.
- Students can reread familiar texts placing emphasis on reading accurately, with expression, and at an appropriate rate.
- Students can practice reading the sights words and/or vocabulary being taught in the classroom.

To Increase Mathematics Fluency:

• Students must practice math facts, such as addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division, for a minimum of ten minutes daily at home.

Report Cards and Conferences

Report cards are given four times per year. First quarter report cards will be distributed at the November Parent Teacher Conference. Please logon to the Parent Portal to view report cards for Quarters 2-4.

Parent Workshops

We will host an evening of parent workshops on Thursday, October 19, 2017 at 6:30 pm. This will be an opportunity for parents to learn more about the school-wide goals from the principal, select teachers and staff. Please look for the flyer in your child's backpack.

The principal will host several Coffee and Conversation sessions for parents where she will provide opportunities for open discussions related to school-wide curriculum and instruction. Please look for the flyers in your child's backpack.

Meet the Teacher Night

"Meet the Teacher" nights will be held on Monday, September 25, 2017 for grades K – 2 and on Thursday, September 28, 2017 for grades 3 & 4. These nights give parents/guardians the opportunity to meet their children's teachers at the start of the school year and learn about curriculum and activities that take place during the school year.

Visitors and Parking

Please use the parking lot if you are visiting the school. Parking is NEVER permitted in the front of the school or in the traffic circle. Parking in the circle can present a safety concern and blocks the bus lane and fire lanes in case of an emergency.

All visitors should report to the front desk to sign-in. Please have a photo ID when visiting our school. Visitors are required to wear a visitor's pass. Parents are a vital part of their child's education and parents are encouraged to participate in school activities. Visitors are not permitted in classrooms unless prearranged with a teacher. Showing up unannounced to a classroom is not allowed. Please remember to drop-off all items for teachers and students at the front desk. Additionally, parents should schedule appointments to speak with teachers in advance, as teachers are not always available for conferences.

Physical Education and Health

The Jefferson Primary School Physical Education Program provides students with an opportunity to develop their knowledge, physical skill, and character through sport and physical activity. Students learn and experience health and skill related physical fitness warm-ups, as well as individual and team-sport games and activities. Lessons are developed to include interdisciplinary concepts such as: health, science, math and English language arts. In the fourth grade, students will receive specific health education lessons in the classroom by a health education teacher.

Field Day

Jefferson Field Day is a themed annual extravaganza that will take place on Friday, June 8, 2018 with a rain date of Tuesday, June 12, 2018. It is a showcase for the children to display their physical education knowledge, skill development and sportsmanship characteristics which were gained throughout the school year. Through generous funding from the PTA and activities organized by the physical education staff, the children enjoy a fun-filled day of relays and events.

Class Trips

During the course of the year, classes may go on field trips, which are an integral part of the instructional program. Most trips usually require a fee. If you are unable to cover the cost of a trip, please call your child's teacher or someone at the school you feel comfortable speaking with to discuss the issue.

Written permission is required for students to go on trips. Verbal permission will not be accepted. Parents/Guardians must sign and return the permission slip sent home. Students who do not bring in a permission slip will not be permitted to attend the trip. These students will remain in school to do academic work.

Students' Bill of Rights

- 1. I have the right to feel safe and secure in my school.
- 2. I have the right to be treated with respect which means no one should hurt my feelings on purpose.
- 3. I have the right to hear and be heard in school.
- 4. I have the right to expect my property will be safe in school.
- 5. I have a right to be myself in this school. This means that no one should treat me unfairly because I am black or white, fat or thin, boy or girl, tall or short, adult or child, handicapped or because of my religious beliefs.
- 6. I have the right to travel to and from school in a safe environment.
- 7. I have the right to feel safe on the playground at all times.
- 8. I have the right to eat my lunch in a pleasant, orderly and clean atmosphere.
- 9. I have the right to attend school without being harmed by my classmates. This means that no one should be permitted to hit me, pinch me, kick me, threaten me, push me, or hurt me.
- 10. I have the responsibility to respect the rights of others. This means I will not hit, kick, threaten, push or hurt anyone.

- 11. I have the responsibility to treat others with respect which means I will not tease or try to hurt the feelings of others.
- 12. I have the responsibility to help keep the school calm and quiet. This means I will not yell, make loud noises or disturb others.
- 13. I have the responsibility not to take or destroy the property of others.
- 14. I have the responsibility to respect others as individuals and not to treat others unfairly because they are black or white, fat or thin, boy or girl, tall or short, adult or child, handicapped or because of their religious beliefs.
- 15. I have the responsibility to sit and stay in my seat and listen to the bus driver.
- 16. I have the responsibility to use the playground area and equipment in the correct way and obey all safety rules.
- 17. I have the responsibility to eat my lunch and clean up in an orderly manner.
- 18. I have the responsibility to make the school safe by not hitting anyone, pinching anyone, kicking anyone, threatening anyone, pushing anyone, or hurting anyone.
