COMMUNICATIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mrs. Rogan thanked the central administration team and the Building and Grounds team for all the hours and hard work, for the constant updates by Mr. Polansky to the board and the community. Mrs. Rogan also thanked Bari Fehrs and PTA members, and James Graber and the teachers who came to the high school and Flower Hill to help when the schools were opened as warming centers.

Moment of Silence for James Conte

Mrs. Rogan asked for a moment of silence in honor of James Conte who passed away. He was a vital and beloved member of our community and a parent of children in our district, as well as being a member of the New York State Assembly who worked tirelessly for our district and community.

Mr. Palacios acknowledged the Young Leaders Organization who got together to collect food and non-perishable items for those affected by the storm. He also congratulated the teams who made it to the playoffs: football, field hockey and soccer, and the golf team who won the League 3 Championship.

Mrs. Hebert congratulated the Blue Devils Marching Band who took 3rd place in the competition in Syracuse. They had to cut their trip short in order to get home before the storm, but they came home victorious and we are very proud of them.

Mrs. Hebert attended the Open House that took place on Saturday, November 17th at Huntington High School. The students represented our school well. They were articulate and honest and happy to answer the questions posed to them.

Mr. Polansky thanked the staff who worked so hard to get our buildings ready for reopening after the storm. Huntington High School and Flower Hill were opened as warming centers. Staff and students put forth a team effort that was remarkable.

Mr. Polansky congratulated the Blue Devil Marching Band for their victory in Syracuse. The band members donated their snacks to the hurricane relief effort.

Mr. Polansky commended the Drama Club for their performances that were amazing even after missing so many rehearsals because of the storm. In lieu of real flowers, they made paper flowers and donated the money to the victims of Hurricane Sandy.

1st PUBLIC COMMENTARY

Members of the community were given the opportunity to address the Board of Education on items listed in *Items for Discussion/Action*.

2012-2013 District Calendar Revisions

Mr. Polansky indicated that school must be in session for 180 days and due to Hurricane Sandy and the nine school days lost it is necessary to make up the instructional time. Mr. Polansky prepared a draft calendar. Discussion followed.
