## **ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION/ACTION**

**Presentation – 2013-2014 Budget Presentation** – Mr. Polansky explained tax rate v. tax levy in detail explaining that the 2% tax cap will routinely be higher for districts due to allowable exclusions. Mr. Polansky explained the eight-step calculation, based on available figures, that is used to arrive at the tax levy. Discussion took place.

### 2013-2014 District Calendar

Mr. Polansky discussed a draft calendar for the 2013-2014 school year. Changes needed to be made to the previously adopted calendar because the State Education Department changed dates for June testing. Discussion took place regarding the BOCES calendar and aligning with it. The new 2013-2014 calendar will be adopted at the next board meeting.

### **Transportation Limits**

Discussion about changing the transportation limits which would have to be presented to the voters in a referendum took place. The Board decided to leave transportation as it currently is therefore, a referendum would not be necessary.
