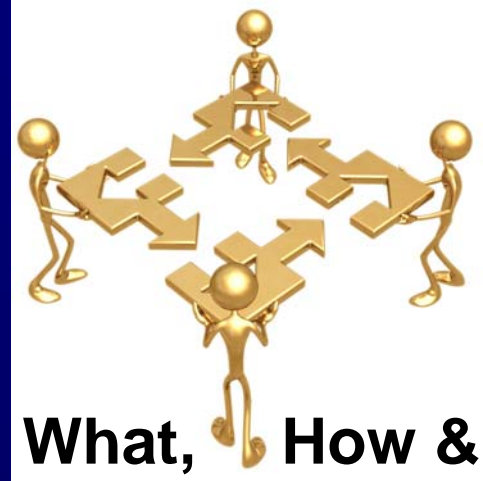
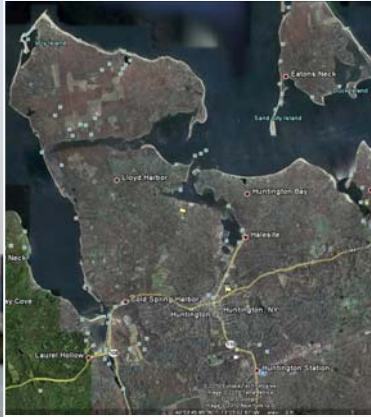

Do not construct any New Buildings

Do not include 300 Nassau Rd (Touro) or Town Hall
