The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District was held on Monday, March 5, 2012 at Jack Abrams School, Huntington Station, New York. The meeting was called to order at 6:05 PM.

COMMUNICATIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mrs. Black and Mrs. Rogan reported on the Spelling Bee competition that they were asked to judge.

Mrs. Black announced the Greater Huntington Civic Group is honoring several people within the Township of Huntington including Mr. Polansky and our students, Juliana Coraor, Megan Hansen and Josh Solomowitz. This gala event will take place at the Crescent Club on April 21, 2012. Tickets are available through the Greater Huntington Civic Association.

Mr. Polansky announced that our four National Merit Semi-Finalists have reached the Finals. They are: Kaja Coraor, Andrew Ku, Jeffrey Sun, and Matthew Petryk. Congratulations to them.

Mr. Polansky announced the National History Day Competition was held this past week. There were four 3rd place winners. Ryan Lader won 3rd place for Senior Historical Paper and he is representing Huntington High School and the Long Island region at the next level of the competition, which is the state level, and will take place in Cooperstown. Other 3rd place winners are Matthew Beeby, Monica Casabona, and Christine O'Grady. Over 575 students participated in the event. Mr. Polansky congratulated the students and thanked Lauren Desiderio, Advisor for National History Day, and Joseph Leavy.

Mr. Polansky thanked the Music Department and the Arts-In-Education Committee for their work with the Engemann Theatre. The Engemann Theatre donated \$2,600 to the Art-In-Education Program. This donation is greatly appreciated.

Mr. Polansky recognized several athletes for their accomplishments during the winter athletic season: Gunther Cassell, Jake Goldstein, and Tyriek Johnson.

1st PUBLIC COMMENTARY

Members of the community were given the opportunity to address the Board of Education on items listed in *Items for Discussion/Action*. Mrs. Rogan reminded everyone that we follow *Robert's Rules of Order*. Mrs. Rogan announced that the March 26th Board Meeting is a Budget Workshop and there will be open discussion with the public. *Public Commentary* began at 8:45 PM and ended at 8:57 PM.

PRESENTATION

2012-2013 Budget

Mr. Polansky presented a working budget that is a starting point. He indicated that the Board of Education will adopt a budget on April 16th. Mr. Polansky started with an overview of the expenditure categories comparing 2011-2012 to 2012-2013. He then

discussed three specific areas in detail: the Board of Education, Central Administration and Transportation. Mr. Polansky discussed the cost to reopen Jack Abrams School. This cost would have to be factored into the overall budget. Discussion followed.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION/ACTION

Building Use Fees

Mr. Polansky presented to the Board a list of users of our facilities and our fee schedule as compared to our neighboring districts. Administration had prepared four different new fee schedules for consideration by the Board. There was discussion and it was decided that revisions would be made and presented to the Board at the next meeting.

Iack Abrams School

Mrs. Rogan indicated that she and Mr. Polansky attended a Woodhull PTA meeting where the issue of Jack Abrams was brought up by several parents. Parents would like the Board to make it clear what Jack Abrams will be used for if it is not reopened this coming school year. There was discussion and Mrs. Rogan indicated that this will be an agenda item for discussion at a future Board Meeting.
