Did you know you could be a colonial craftsman? Huntington Village had many skilled craftsmen in the 18th century. Most of these crafts are gone but your child will have fun learning the skills right here in Huntington. Participants will learn how to make their own newspaper, the old fashion way followed by metal-smithing and making a handsome lantern. Each child will bring these crafts home.

Did you know ...there was slavery in Huntington? Join us at the Old Burying Ground for a tour and history of some of the famous families of Huntington and their slaves. After the tour, each participant will return to the Conklin barn to make a small quilt sample, similar to the slave quilts used in the underground railroad to send messages safely to each other.

Did you know...colonial children MADE their own toys and had to learn embroidery? Make a colonial game and learn the art of sewing and enjoy some time playing with colonial toys, instead of watching television!
