



He later obtained his certification as a school administrator from Long Island University. After working through the Elwood School District from 1997 through 2003, he was hired as the dean of students at Huntington High school from 2003-present. Soon after he was hired, Gilmor wanted to establish a Habitat for Humanity chapter for Huntington High School as early as he could. Habitat for Humanity is a worldwide organization dedicated to eliminating poverty and homelessness by building housing side-by-side with those in need. The high school's Habitat chapter was founded by Mr. Gilmor in 2003. He has done amazing work for people in dire need.

He has a 16 year record of helping victims of catastrophes both near and far as well as being the driving force behind building a house right here in Suffolk for someone in need of shelter. He is also a faculty advisor for a club called Natural Helpers which goes hand in hand with Habitat for Humanity. Natural Helpers is a club which features well-trained students helping their peers work through personal issues and challenges both big and small. Along side of both clubs being run by Gilmor and thriving because of him, students have also come to love Gilmor as more than a teacher, they see him as a friend and mentor. He has supported all of his students through every challenge and failure they endure. Students come to him for friendly advice or to ask questions about their future. Gilmor always has the right answers and students see him more and more everyday because of his positive attitude.


ENGLISH TEACHER, KELLY KRYCINSKY
