COLLEGE & DMISSION CRITERIA

4 year colleges

- Transcript
- Standardized test scores (OR test optional <u>www.fairtest.org</u>)
- Extracurricular activities
- Recommendations
- Essay
- Portfolio/audition

2 year colleges

- Transcript
- Standardized tests (may used for placement)

COLLEGE & PPLICATION OPTIONS

- **Regular Decision**: "I am interested and if accepted, I might want to attend."
- Early Action: "I am very interested and if accepted, I will most likely attend."
- Early Decision: "It's true love, and if accepted, I *must attend*, because it is *contractually binding*." (ED I & II)
- Single Choice/Restrictive Early Action: "I'm very interested, and you're the one and only school I may apply to early." (Non-binding)
- Rolling Admission: "I must apply as soon as possible because applications are reviewed and decisions are made on a rolling basis."

HOW DOES THE COLLEGE & PPLIC & TION PROCESS BEGIN?

- Supplemental essay (individual colleges)
- Early Decision (ED) contract and Final Report

COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCEDURES

All college application related materials will be submitted electronically through Naviance. This includes the following:

- Transcripts
 - SRAR: Self Reported Academic Record
- Teacher recommendations and evaluation forms
- Counselor recommendations and Secondary School Reports
- Other relevant college documents (Early Decision agreements, Fee Waivers, etc.)

THE CO&LITION & PPLIC & TION

- The platform provides a single, centralized toolkit for students to organize, build, and refine their applications to numerous institutions. Coalition schools graduate at least 70 percent of their students within six years, with many having much higher graduation rates. There are currently over 150 Coalition member colleges across the country.
- The application is completed online and can be accessed by logging onto <u>www.coalitionforcollegeaccess.org.</u> Some schools will accept the Coalition application in addition to other applications, such as the Common Application, while other schools are exclusive and therefore, require students to use the Coalition application.

SHOULD I TEST? SHOULD I SEND MY SCORES?

- Test optional: applicant has the option of submitting standardized test scores for consideration with their application
- Test blind: scores will not be reviewed for any candidate for admission. The goal of a test-blind policy is to remove the pressure on students to provide a score if some others are doing so.
- Test flexible: refers to adjustments to testing requirements, particularly in locations where testing opportunities were limited

STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK (SUNY)

- 64 campuses
 - 30 community colleges
- 7,000+ academic programs
- 370K students enrolled in the SUNY system (4 and 2 year colleges)
- Varying academic requirements
- Suspended the requirement of SAT and ACT tests through the Fall of 2023, Spring 2024, and Summer 2024 admission cycles. Test optional provides students the option to choose to send or withhold scores. Some colleges may require scores for scholarship consideration.
- Common application, SUNY application, or Coalition application
- Various deadlines (EA, ED, RD or rolling)

CITY UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK (CUNY)

- 14 senior colleges
- 10 community colleges
- 1,750+ programs of study
- 270K students enrolled in the CUNY system (2 and 4 year colleges)
- Varying academic requirements
- First-year applicants can choose whether to submit SAT or ACT exam scores as part of their application. The admission decision will be based primarily on a student's academic preparation in high school, including overall grade-point-average, course grades and the academic rigor of their high school curriculum.
- Macaulay Honors College at 8 senior colleges (11/16/22 deadline-10/24/22 HHS deadline)
- One application and one fee used for up to 6 campuses
- February 1st deadline (general freshman admission) and then rolling admission on a space available basis, 1/10/23 HHS suggested deadline 23

RECORDS RELEASE FORM

- Available in the College Office and on the Google Classroom
- Student and parent/guardian signature required
- Checklist
- 1 RRF/college
- RRF due to the College Office 15 school days before the application deadline. May be dropped off or emailed.







- Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
 - Federal student financial aid, such as Pell grant, student loans, and college work-study. In addition, most states and schools use FAFSA information to award their financial aid.
 - Available 10/01/2022

- NYS Tuition Assistance Program (TAP)
 - New York's grant program that helps eligible NYS residents attending NYS institutions
 - Grant based upon NYS taxable income
 - Available 10/01/2022 (FAFSA MUST BE COMPLETED FIRST)

- CSS/ Financial Aid Profile
 - Nearly 400 colleges & universities use the profile to distribute nonfederal student aid funds
 - Available 10/01/2022
