What are Advanced Placement Courses ?

- ★ The AP program offers college level courses and exams that you can take in high school. Students take the AP exam in May and can earn college credit based on their earned score.
- ★ AP courses are offered in the discipline of arts, English, history, and social science, math, and computer science, the sciences, and world languages and culture.
- ★ Students should choose an AP course based on the subjects their passionate about and the classes they do well.

Benefits of taking AP courses

Research consistently shows that AP students are better prepared for college than students who don't take AP, regardless of their exam score. They're more likely to enroll and stay in college, do well in their classes, and graduate in four years. Taking AP courses and exams can help you:
