Mathematics: What Your Child Will Learn in Kindergarten.

- Know how to say and write numbers to 10.
- Know the count sequence.
- Count to tell the number of objects.
- Compare numbers (greater, less, equal)
 - Understand addition as putting together and adding to
- Understand subtraction as taking apart and taking from.
- Work with numbers 11-19 to gain foundations for place value.
- Describe and compare measurable attributes (length, weight)
 - Classify objects and count the number of objects in each category
 - Identify and describe shapes.
 - Analyze, compare, create, and compose shapes.





English Language Arts: What Your Child Will Learn in Kindergarten

- Recognizing upper and lower case letters
- Identifying letter sounds
- Blending and segmenting sounds in words
- Producing and recognizing rhyming patterns
- Reading high frequency words
- Asking and answering questions about fictional and informational texts
- Identifying characters, settings, and events in a story
- Analyzing text and illustrations
- Participating in discussions by listening and speaking
- Writing using drawings and basic sound knowledge

Who Receives ENL instruction?

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- ENL classes are for students that are learning English as a new language (ENL).
- If a student speaks another language at home, they are interviewed to see if they need to take an English proficiency exam called the NYSITELL.
- The NYSITELL is given at registration or at the start of the school year.

- Students that meet the requirements will receive a stand-alone period, a co-teach period, or both periods of instruction with a certified ENL teacher.
 - At the end of the school year, students will take the NYSESLAT, which determines their ENL level and the types of service that will be required for the following school year.

What is Taught in ENL classes?

- ENL students are taught using the Leveled Literacy Intervention System (LLI). Students use the LLI system during a stand-alone period when they are pulled in a small group to the ENL teacher's classroom.
- The LLI system provides daily lessons in reading, writing, and phonics/ word study. Through reading, talking, and writing about reading, students extend their knowledge of English and expand their vocabulary.
- The reading focus in the LLI program is to have students comprehend texts on a deeper level. The writing focus in the LLI program is to have students learn how to compose and develop writing pieces.
- Teachers provide students with take home books and parent letters at the
 end of every lesson. Parent letters are provided in English and Spanish.
- During a co-teach period, the ENL teacher will go into the classroom and work with a group of ELLs . The ENL teacher will work with the classroom teacher and ENL students to differentiate the lesson, target vocabulary, work on writing, and develop multiple strategies ELLs can use within the classroom.
- Students make great progress due to ENL classes and over time become fluent in English.

Nurse's Information

- Emergency cards must be complete and on file on the first day of school. Please communicate any changes in your address or phone #. (see folder for card)
- Physicals are required for ALL incoming kindergarteners. A district doctor visits the school for anyone without an updated physical. Proof of ALL immunizations is required on the first day of school.
- Eye and ear screenings will take place each year

- Please supply information about any special health problems (for example - food allergies and asthma) your child may have.
- Students must be fever-free, have not vomited or had diarrhea for 24 hours before sending them back to school. If your child has a diagnosis of strep, pink eye, etc. please call the nurse.

Breakfast & Lunch

- All families must fill out a one Free and Reduced Lunch Application (one form per family).
- Forms will be mailed to each family late August early September and will be available in English and Spanish.

- The Free/Reduced Lunch Application is also available online through My School Apps. Links for both My School Bucks and My School Apps can be found under Food Services in the Main Navigation tab on the district site.
 - The Food and Nutrition Department processes the lunch application and determines eligibility for free or reduced lunch according to the NYS Income Eligibility Guidelines.

Breakfast & Lunch

- Prepaid breakfast and lunch tickets are available and may be purchased for full-year, half-year or 20-day increments. Payments can be sent to the cafeteria, please be sure to put your child's name on the check/money envelope.
- If your child forgets their lunch, the school will provide a meal. Any child that goes through the lunch line <u>must</u> be provided with a meal. Their account will be charged accordingly.

- No financial information will be disclosed to your child, all notices of negative balances will be mailed or emailed home on a monthly basis.

- 3:15 p.m. Pick-up for kindergarten students will take place at the door by the playground (see door sign). Please park in the designated parking area (not the traffic circle).
- Parents/guardians that pick-up their child early and after 3:00 p.m. will be required to wait until 3:15 p.m. and pick-up at the designated pick-up door. Parents/guardians will not be permitted to pick-up their child between 3:00 p.m. 3:15 p.m.

- A note must be sent with your child if someone other than yourself is going to pick up your child from school or the bus stop.
 - Having the correct phone numbers to reach parents or emergency contacts is very important to us. Please notify us immediately of any changes to your phone numbers or home address.
