COMMUNICATIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mr. Finello said that on Friday, October 27, 2006, a storm caused a power loss at Huntington Intermediate. He thanked Mr. Rispoli and staff who worked all weekend to restore power.

Mr. Finello announced that the Varsity football team is in the playoffs and will be playing at Kings Park at 1:000 PM on Saturday, November 11, 2006.

Mr. Lee said that he went to a very informative meeting at the high school for high school parents hosted by New York Times with regard to college admissions. An Assistant Provost from C. W. Post indicated that C.W. Post offers college credit for some courses that are offered at the high school. Mrs. Black shared that she teaches at Kings Park and Syracuse University offers similar opportunities. Mr. Finello will look into it.

PUBLIC COMMENTARY

Mr. Lee responded that there is an interest but a committee is examining all the possible scenarios. This same parent doesn't feel the district would be balanced with an addition to Woodhull. Mr. Lee explained that information is still being gathered.

A resident is concerned at the math scores and wanted to know why we are so low. Mr. Finello explained the testing process.

A parent of a dual language student wanted to know if the dual language program helped the ELL students in testing.
