REGULAR MEETING HUNTINGTON UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF EDUCATION March 5, 2007

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District was held on Monday, March 5, 2007, at Huntington Intermediate School, Lowndes Avenue, Huntington Station, NY 11746. Mr. Lee called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m..

ROLL CALL

There were present Board of Education Members Black, Collyer, Lee, Marchi, McGrath, Rogan; Superintendent Finello, Messrs. Giani, Grackin, O'Brien and Mrs. Bender. Mr. Forte was absent.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

A MOTION was made by Mrs. Marchi and seconded by Mrs. Collyer to go into Executive Session to discuss legal and personnel matters.

MOTION carried.

At 6:30 p.m. the Board of Education went into Executive Session.

At 8:00 p.m. Mr. Lee reconvened the meeting.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION PROCEDURE

Mr. Lee discussed the exits to be used in the event of any emergency.

SMOKE FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT

Mr. Lee announced that the Huntington Union Free School District is a smoke-free district and smoking is prohibited in all buildings and on school grounds.

Elementary Facilities and Class Size Committee (ELFACS) Recommendations

Mrs. Black asked how this attendance zone was chosen. Mr. Giani responded that the committee looked to extend already existing zones and looked at number of students and student ethnicity to do so. This brought better balance in enrollment and ethnicity. Extensive discussion followed.

COMMUNICATIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

National Merit Scholarship Finalists

Mr. Finello was proud to announce that High School seniors Hanna Payne and Matt Rienzo have been named National Merit Scholarship finalists this year.

Girls Varsity Basketball

Mr. Lee announced that the Girls Varsity Basketball team almost made Huntington history this year. They were two points away from being the Suffolk Girls Basketball champions. It was the first time Huntington High School Girls Varsity Basketball team was in the county championship.

South Huntington

Mr. Lee thanked South Huntington for allowing Huntington High School to use the Walt Whitman auditorium on March 1st for their concert.

High School Field

Mr. McGrath saw boys soccer team on the new field at the high school after a heavy rainstorm and they were able to play as though it had not rained.

New York State Wrestling Tournament

Mr. Finello announced that Jose Vasquez placed third in the 96 lb weight at the New York State Wrestling Tournament and won a bronze medal.

PUBLIC COMMENTARY

At that portion of the meeting set aside for questions and comments from the public a parent asked if the district is doing away with senior portfolio class at the high school. Mr. Giani explained that there is a projected decrease for that class for next year. Mr. McGrath requested a list of other classes that may be eliminated next year and a copy of the curriculum guide. Mr. Lee wants consideration given to running AP French.

A parent was upset about paying for AP tests. Would like it placed in the budget. He also would like the libraries in all the buildings to be the central focus of the building and have the computers in the library. He also thinks the district should hire a technology person for computer maintenance similar to a director position. He also inquired about participation in more science competitions for the high school students who want to excel in science programs.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION AND ACTION

Proposal for Architectural Services

Mr. Smith from Burton, Behrendt, Smith, reported on the proposal for a facilities study that will be done by his firm for the Touro Building. He explained that the study would show what would be required to put Touro back in line. The study should take 6-8 weeks.

Mr. Smith also reported on the proposed spatial needs analysis for Finley Middle School to add space to the building to house either 6-8th graders or 5-8th graders. This analysis would take 4-8 weeks.

Mr. O'Brien said the long-range planning study being done by Western Suffolk BOCES will be ready for March 19th meeting.

Whereas, said capital improvement projects at the above schools are subject to classification under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA); and

Whereas, replacement, rehabilitation, and reconstruction of a structure or facility, in kind on the same site, including upgrading building to meet building or fire codes and routine activities of educational institutions, including expansion of existing facilities by less than 10,000 square feet of gross floor area, are classified as Type II under the current Department of Environmental Conservation SEQRA Regulation (Section 6 NYCRR 617.5 (c)(2); and

Whereas, the SEQRA declare Type II Actions to be actions that have no significant impact on the environment and require no further review under SEQRA;

Now, therefore be it resolved, that the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District declares itself as lead agency for the proposed capital improvement projects and has examined all information related to the capital improvement projects and has determined that the above described capital improvement projects at Huntington High School, Flower Hill Primary School, Southdown Primary School, Finley Middle School, and Jefferson Primary School are classified as Type II Actions pursuant to Section 617.5 (c)(2) of the SEQRA regulations.

EXCEL Proposition

A MOTION was made by Mrs. Marchi and seconded by Mrs. Collyer to approve the following Proposition that will be placed on the May ballot enabling the school district to use the EXCEL Aid that is due:

PROPOSITION

RESOLVED:

(a) That the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District, in the County of Suffolk, New York (the "District"), is hereby authorized to undertake a facilities improvement project (the "EXCEL Project") substantially as referred to and described in an outline prepared by the District (the "Plan"), which Plan is on file and available for public inspection in the office of the District Clerk, said EXCEL Project consisting of the construction of improvements to all District school buildings, including (as and where necessary): improvements to the fire alarm, security and public address systems; replacement of lockers, doors, floor tiles, stage wiring, gym partition and clock systems; asbestos abatement; and HVAC improvements; all of the foregoing to include the original equipment, machinery, apparatus and ancillary or related site, demolition and other work required in connection therewith; and to expend therefor, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, an amount not to exceed the estimated total cost of \$1,359,070; provided that the detailed costs of the

components of the EXCEL Project as set forth in detail in the Plan may be reallocated among such components if the Board of Education shall determine that such reallocation is in the best interests of the District;

- (b) that a tax is hereby voted in the aggregate amount of not to exceed \$1,359,070 to finance such costs, such tax to be levied and collected in installments in such years and in such amounts as shall be determined by said Board of Education;
- (c) that the District has been allotted and expects to receive EXCEL ("Expanding our Children's Education and Learning") aid in a sufficient amount to fund said estimated total cost of not to exceed \$1,359,070 and the amount of taxes herein authorized to be levied will be reduced by the amount of any EXCEL aid so received by the District; and
- (d) that in anticipation of said tax, bonds of the District are hereby authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$1,359,070 and a tax is hereby voted to pay the interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.

Such Proposition shall appear on the ballot labels to be inserted in the voting machines used for voting at said Annual District Meeting and Election in substantially the following condensed form:

RESOLVED:

(a) That the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District, in the County of Suffolk, New York (the "District"), is hereby authorized to construct improvements to all District school buildings and to expend therefore an amount not to exceed \$1,359,070; (b) that a tax is hereby voted in the aggregate amount of not to exceed \$1,359,070 to finance such costs, such tax to be levied and collected in installments in such years and in such amounts as shall be determined by said Board of Education; (c) that the District has been allotted and expects to receive EXCEL ("Expanding our Children's Education and Learning") aid in a sufficient amount to fund said estimated total cost of not to exceed \$1,359,070 and the amount of taxes herein authorized to be levied will be reduced by the amount of any EXCEL aid so received by the District; and (d) that in anticipation of said tax, bonds of the District are hereby authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$1,359,070 and a

tax is hereby voted to pay the interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.
