REGULAR MEETING HUNTINGTON UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF EDUCATION SEPTEMBER 17, 2007

A meeting of the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District was held on Monday, September 17, 2007, at Huntington Intermediate School, Lowndes Avenue, Huntington Station, NY 11746. Mr. McGrath called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

ROLL CALL

EXECUTIVE SESSION

A MOTION was made by Mrs. Collyer and seconded by Mrs. Rogan to go into Executive Session to discuss legal and personnel matters.

MOTION carried.

At 6:30 p.m. the Board of Education went into Executive Session.

At 7:40 p.m. Mr. McGrath reconvened the meeting.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION PROCEDURE

Mr. McGrath discussed the exits to be used in the event of any emergency.

SMOKE-FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT

Mr. McGrath announced that the Huntington Union Free School District is a smoke-free district and smoking is prohibited in all buildings and on school grounds.

COMMUNICATIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

School Opening September 2007

Mr. Finello reported on the successful opening of school on September 5, 2007. There are 4,404 students, 855 employees, 28 new teachers, 2 new administrators and 35 new support staff. The Facilities Department worked on several in-house projects and several capital projects. Overall it was a very successful opening.

The schools were well prepared and the classrooms were cleaned and ready for the teachers and children. Mr. Finello thanked the staff and enumerated all of the departments in the district who were responsible. He also thanked the PTA for their support of the Principals, the executive boards, the Band Parents who spent countless hours during the summer and especially the last two weeks before the opening. He also reported the New Teacher Orientation went smoothly and we are all looking forward to a very successful year.

Mr. Giani reported that on opening day transportation of the students went pretty well. It was significantly improved from last year. We are working closely with Huntington Coach reviewing and refining routes when necessary. Mr. Giani encouraged parents who were in the audience and had any concerns or problems to fill out a Transportation Report and he would look into the problem.

Marching Band Season

Mrs. Fretz, Director of The Performing Arts, reported that the Marching Band is off to a wonderful start this season. The Band had competed on Sunday, September 16, 2007 at Sachem High School and scored the highest of all nine bands within their division and won the entire competition. Mrs. Fretz then gave information regarding the practices this season, the locations, and the reasons for it. Mrs. Fretz informed the Board of Education and those in the audience of the steps she is taking to "be a good neighbor" in regard to accommodating those living close to the high school during band practices. Discussion followed.

Mr. Mike Mohlenhoff, Band Parent President, praised the Marching Band and commended the staff and children. There was extensive discussion about safety issues on the practice field when the band is practicing at night, scheduling issues, and steps being taken to protect the track. Mr. Mohlenhoff invited all present to come and see the Marching Band perform. There will be a home show on October 14, 2007.

There was some discussion about outside organizations using the field. Mr. McGrath reviewed the guidelines for who is eligible to use the field. Mr. McGrath asked Mr. Grackin when the planting of the arborvitae would occur. Mr. Grackin indicated it was already scheduled.

PUBLIC COMMENTARY

At the portion of the meeting set aside for questions and comments from the public a parent and resident thanked Mr. Finello for being such an outstanding Superintendent. She also had questions regarding the legal budget line. Mrs. Collyer answered her questions.

Another resident had questions regarding steps taken to educate new board members as to their roles. Mrs. Collyer explained that all new board members attend conferences to prepare them for their role. Discussion followed.

Noel Harper, Flower Hill Kindergarten teacher, expressed concern regarding the new Wellness Policy and kindergarten curriculum. She requested the district revisit and modify the decision made. Discussion followed. She also invited the Board to visit her classroom.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

Facilities Study

There was a presentation by Roger Smith, Architect of the firm Burton, Behrendt and Smith, addressing the different options to alleviate the overcrowding in the classrooms. Mr. Smith presented various options for Woodhull, Flower Hill and Finley based upon the long range Demographic Study done by Western Suffolk BOCES last spring. Mr. Smith explained the costs were not in place yet. Extensive discussion followed.

At this point Mr. McGrath opened the floor to Public Commentary.

PUBLIC COMMENTARY

There were several questions posed by members of the community, PTA, and SEPTA members:

- When is enrollment expected to peak?
- Was the ELFACS Committee suspended?
- As a result of additional space, could we expect test scores to go up and class size to go down?
- Had the district factored in any additional zoning planned by the Town of Huntington when planning for this project?
- Had the Board considered moving Central Administration out of Huntington Intermediate School?

Discussion followed each of these items.
