REGULAR MEETING HUNTINGTON UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF EDUCATION January 29, 2007

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District was held on Monday, January 29, 2007, at Huntington Intermediate School, Lowndes Avenue, Huntington Station, NY 11746. Mr. Lee called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

ROLL CALL

There were present Board of Education Members Black, Collyer, Forte, Lee, Marchi, McGrath; Superintendent Finello, Messrs. Giani, Grackin, O'Brien and Mrs. Bender. Mrs. Rogan arrived at 7:15 p.m.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

A MOTION was made by Mrs. Marchi and seconded by Mrs. Collyer to go into Executive Session to discuss legal and personnel matters.

MOTION carried.

At 6:30 p.m. the Board of Education went into Executive Session.

At 7:50 p.m. Mr. Lee reconvened the meeting.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION PROCEDURE

Mr. Lee discussed the exits to be used in the event of any emergency.

SMOKE FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT

Mr. Lee announced that the Huntington Union Free School District is a smokefree district and smoking is prohibited in all buildings and on school grounds.

COMMUNICATIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mr. Lee thanked the Huntington Foundation for Excellence in Education (HFEE) for the successful annual dinner at Oheka Castle that raised money to help support educational programs in the district. Beverly Wayne was honored by the Foundation at this year's dinner.

Mr. McGrath reported that he and Mrs. Rogan attended a worthwhile alcohol seminar dealing with alcohol drinking by high school students.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION AND ACTION

Elementary Facilities and Class Size Committee (ELFACS) Presentation

Mr. Giani presented the available options that are recommended by the ELFACS Committee to relieve the overcrowding at Southdown, Jefferson and Woodhull.

A parent asked what size is a full-size classroom. Mr. Giani responded.

A parent asked why Southdown will have a dedicated art and music room. Mr. Lee explained that having dedicated art and music rooms would be at the discretion of the principal.

A Southdown parent asked why are class sizes increasing at Southdown. Mr. Lee explained that one of the things the committee is studying is decreasing class sizes.

Mr. Forte asked if 2008-09 projections are available. Extensive discussion followed.

Mrs. Collyer is concerned that this proposal is not adequate. She would have liked more options. Extensive discussion followed.

Mrs. Black wants the students and parents who are moved to have support at the new buildings and to be checked on periodically to see how they are adjusting.

Mrs. Marchi is not in favor of the proposal and would like to go back to the Committee.

Mr. Lee would like to see the Board take a look at Toaz for the future.

Mrs. Marchi would like the Board to consider adding rooms to Finley Middle School and move the sixth grade to Finley.

Mrs. Rogan suggested increasing the size of the ELFACS Committee to include some secondary people.

A parent wanted to know if the students who are being moved would be supported and she wanted to know why many of the students being moved are Hispanic. Mr. Lee explained.

A parent said he is afraid that his two children will go to separate schools.

A parent said that her children are afraid of the move.

A parent of two fourth graders at Woodhull asked if they would have to move if they are in dual language program. She was told they would not have to move if they were in the dual language program.

A parent inquired as to how the committee members were selected. Mr. Lee explained. The parent inquired if engineer or architects were consulted and why isn't the Board looking favorably at Touro. Mr. Collyer explained that several million dollars would be needed to restore it to code.

A parent asked if Touro was purchased who would be going there. She had other concerns about the committee's recommendations.

District Use of EXCEL Funds

Mr. Grackin explained that all school districts in New York State were allocated money for either new construction, renovation of existing facilities or technology. Mr. Grackin shared suggestions that he and Mr. Rispoli developed for the EXCEL funds. How these funds are spent must be approved by the public and will be included as a proposition at the annual budget vote and election in May. The Board must adopt a resolution by the March 19th Board meeting. Alternative uses of these funds will be brought to the next meeting. Discussion followed.

HHS Turf Field Usage Requirements

Mr. Grackin explained the supplemental requirements for use of the high school turf field. The second requirement will be amended to include wording regarding residents of the school district, delete the third requirement and adding a new one regarding a mandatory meeting to take place prior to usage.

Fixed Assets Inventory

Mr. Grackin explained the Fixed Assets Inventory and would like to have the inventory updated. The insurance company will pick up the cost.
