HUNTINGTON UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT ANNUAL BUDGET VOTE AND ELECTION MAY 19, 2009

A Special District Election of the Huntington Union Free School District of the Town of Huntington, County of Suffolk, was held at Huntington High School, Oakwood and McKay Roads, Huntington, New York on May 19, 2009.

At 6:00 a.m. Daylight Savings Time, Mr. Dwyer, President of the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District, announced that the polls were open and would remain open until 9:00 p.m.

At 9:00 p.m. Mr. Dwyer announced that the polls were closed and that anyone in line would have the right to vote.

A canvas of the voting machines by the District Clerk showed the following results:

PROPOSITION I (BUDGET)

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District, Town of Huntington, Suffolk County, New York be authorized to expend \$104,814,259 the amount set forth in the proposed budget and to accumulate the balance proposed in the said budget during the school year beginning July 1, 2009, and to levy the necessary tax therefore.

RESOLUTION Adopted.

PROPOSITION II (CAPITAL RESERVE FUND)

RESOLVED that the Board of Education be authorized to expend from the Building Improvement Fund, established by the voters of the district at the annual district meeting held May 20, 2008 an amount not to exceed \$235,000 for ADA accessibility at Jefferson Primary School; \$29,000 for cafeteria doors at Flower Hill Primary School; \$29,000 for cafeteria doors at Southdown Primary School; \$29,000 for cafeteria doors at Washington Primary School; \$46,000 for auditorium smoke doors at Huntington High School.

VOTE: <u>YES</u> 1,799 <u>NO</u> 640
