# REGULAR MEETING MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION HUNTINGTON U.F.S.D.

# **September 14, 2009**

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District was held on Monday, September 14, 2009 at Jack Abrams Intermediate School, Lowndes Avenue, Huntington Station, New York. The meeting was called to order at 6:10 p.m.

#### **ROLL CALL**

There were present Board of Education Members: Dwyer, Rogan, Black, Brown, McGrath, Paci; Mr. Mulholland, Mr. Sullivan; Superintendent Finello, Mr. Grackin, Dr. Giani, Dr. Card and Mrs. Troffa. Mrs. Benè was absent.

# **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

A MOTION was made by Mr. McGrath and seconded by Mrs. Black to go into Executive Session to discuss contract issues and personnel matters.

#### MOTION carried.

At 6:10 p.m. the Board of Education went into Executive Session.

At 7:48 p.m. Mr. Dwyer reconvened the meeting.

# PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Dwyer led the Board of Education and the others present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

# **EMERGENCY EVACUATION PROCEDURE**

Mr. Dwyer discussed the exits to be used in the event of any emergency.

#### SMOKE-FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT

Mr. Dwyer announced that the Huntington Union Free School District is a smoke-free district and smoking is prohibited in all buildings and on school grounds. Mr. Dwyer also requested that all cell phones be turned off or set to vibrate.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A MOTION was made by Mrs. Brown and seconded by Mrs. Rogan to approve the Minutes of the Board of Education Meeting of August 24, 2009.

#### **COMMUNICATIONS & ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Mr. Dwyer indicated people are very concerned with what has happened around Abrams Intermediate School. He assured the audience that the Board is very concerned also and looking out for the best interest of children and employees. He indicated that the board has reached out to local municipal elected officials and county officials working closely with them to try to address everyone's concerns. Mr. Dwyer then called upon Lora Gellerstein, aide to Legislator Jonathan Cooper, who was asked by Mr. Cooper to read a letter since he was unable to attend the meeting himself. Ms. Gellerstein apologized on behalf of Mr. Cooper for his absence.

Mr. Dwyer added that the board will continue to work with the town and county to address the issues in this neighborhood. He was pleased to see such a large audience at the board meeting.

Mrs. Black welcomed the new teachers to the district. She indicated there are 27 new staff members. She also commended Jim Hoops for the article he wrote on the website for the September 11<sup>th</sup> commemoration. Mrs. Black thanked Mrs. Stokkers for the way she handled a minor bus accident that occurred on the first day of school. Mrs. Black also recognized the participants in an ALS Walk at Eisenhower Park in memory of a member of the community who died last spring. There was a large group of former students who participated and she thanked them.

Mrs. Rogan announced a Walk 4Love Fundraiser to be held on Saturday, September 19, 2009. This "walk" was coordinated by several graduates. She gave the time and place for the run and brought fliers to distribute to encourage participation.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTARY**

A teacher and soon to be homeowner in the district expressed concern over the elimination of the Director of Guidance position at the high school. Every department in the high school had representatives present at the meeting to support the guidance counselors. He implored the board to rethink their decision and reinstate the position of Director of Guidance.

One of the guidance counselors also expressed concerns over the elimination of the position of Director of Guidance and described the ramifications of this decision.

The PTSA president, representing the PTSA executive board, read a statement expressing their concern over the way the empty positions were filled in the district. She also expressed their concern over the elimination of the Director of Guidance at the high school.

A resident and graduate in 2003 announced the Walk 4Love fundraiser to be held on Saturday, September 19, 2009. He explained that the fundraiser is in memory of Jana Piccola, a high school student who lost her life to leukemia. The Walk4Love is to benefit pediatric cancer research. He indicated the location of the walk and invited all to attend.

A father with two children in the district suggested that parents could organize a security patrol around Abrams Intermediate School while school is in session during the times the students are outside for recess or lunch. He discussed the possibility of handing out a letter in order gain support for this.

A parent of a child at Abrams Intermediate thought moving the school was an extreme reaction to this problem. She wanted the board to understand how important this decision is and asked them not to make a hasty decision.

A long time resident commented about the elimination of the Director of Guidance. He also commented about getting the police out of their patrol cars and walking the beat. He commented that it does not make sense to talk about closing the school.

The President of the NAACP, Huntington Branch questioned where the school could be moved to and when. She supports the resolve that we have additional security and is strongly against closing the school. She suggested that the Sheriff's Department be brought in to secure the area. She indicated that the community does not get enough notice about the school board meetings and implored the board to let the community know what is going on.

A resident said we need to raise our voices in order to make this a safe environment.

Mr. Dwyer spoke indicating that the school board wants to work with the community and town in solving these problems. He indicated that Legislator Jonathan Cooper is doing what he can. He encouraged the public to give the board ideas to bring to the legislators. Mr. Dwyer apologized for any consternation that was caused by the rumor that the school would be closing.

#### ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

#### Earn and Learn

Jefry Rosmarin, founder of the Earn and Learn Program reported back to the board on the first year that the high school participated in this program. He described the program and explained that it is privately funded by himself. The first year's results were quite good. He indicated he needed more building level support.

A MOTION was made by Mr. Dwyer and seconded by Mr. Paci to continue the Earn and Learn Program at Huntington High School.

#### Student Enrollments K-12

Mr. Finello explained that over the past several years there is an ebb and flow to enrollment resulting in making predictions in enrollment difficult. Dr. Giani then discussed the specifics of the elementary enrollment as of Friday, September 11, 2009. Dr. Giani discussed each elementary school. He indicated that a fifth section was needed at Washington Primary School. Extensive discussion followed.

# Facilities Usage 2009-2010

Extensive discussion took place regarding space requirements, and enrollments and projections in all the buildings, but most of the discussion centered on the primary buildings. Mr. Finello indicated that small group instructional space is a problem. Mr. Paci pointed out that we are running close to 100 percent capacity in all our buildings. The BOCES Demographic Study that was done for us a couple of years ago was discussed; the problem of Avalon Bay and the additional students that will bring to Flower Hill and Washington Schools was discussed. Mr. McGrath pointed out that the high school is equally maxed out and the space issue is a kindergarten through grade 12 issue. The architect's plan that was done last year was brought up, acquiring new space was discussed and the possibility of putting up a bond issue that the community would support in order to either acquire space or build was also discussed.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTARY**

A parent described technology that is being used in Nassau County to pinpoint where a gunshot comes from and thought maybe we could use it here. There were several other comments made in regard to the safety of the children and suggestions were made such as open enrollment, proposing that parents could pick the school they want to send their child to.

Another comment was made in regard to the Earn and Learn Program, that there were problems with it.

A Washington parent was concerned about space at Washington Primary School.

# **CLOSING REMARKS BY BOARD MEMBERS**

Mrs. Brown commented about the e-mail that was sent out in regard to safety at Abrams Intermediate School and she urged residents to put pressure on the county. She reassured those present that the board is working on it.

Mrs. Black indicated that she made a comment at the last board meeting about moving the children out of Abrams Intermediate. She believes this building should stay open and would never abandon this community.
