REGULAR MEETING MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION HUNTINGTON U.F.S.D.

March 1, 2010

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District was held on Monday, March 1, 2010 at Jack Abrams Intermediate School, Lowndes Avenue, Huntington Station, New York. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

ROLL CALL

There were present Board of Education Members: Dwyer, Rogan, Benè, Black, Brown, McGrath, Paci; Mark Mulholland, Vanessa Sheehan; Superintendent Finello, Mr. Grackin, Dr. Giani, Dr. Card and Mrs. Troffa.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

A MOTION was made by Mrs. Bené and seconded by Mrs. Rogan to go into Executive Session to discuss acquisition of property and contract issues.

MOTION carried.

At 6:30 p.m. the Board of Education went into Executive Session.

At 7:52 p.m. Mr. Dwyer reconvened the meeting.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Dwyer led the Board of Education and the others present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION PROCEDURE

Mr. Dwyer discussed the exits to be used in the event of any emergency.

SMOKE-FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT

Mr. Dwyer announced that the Huntington Union Free School District is a smoke-free district and smoking is prohibited in all buildings and on school grounds. Mr. Dwyer also requested that all cell phones be turned off or set to vibrate.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A MOTION was made by Mr. McGrath and seconded by Mrs. Bené to approve the Minutes of the Board of Education Meeting of February 8, 2010.

COMMUNICATIONS & ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mrs. Bené attended <u>College Night for Juniors</u> and thanked Bernadette Walsh and Ben Baglio for their presentation. Mrs. Bené also thanked teacher, Dana Hartough, for the thank you notes she received from her class. Mrs. Bené read to the class and the students wrote individual thank you letters to Mrs. Bené.

Mrs. Rogan attended a performance of <u>Beauty and the Beast</u> at Jack Abrams Intermediate School. She thanked the staff and students for the wonderful production.

Mrs. Black asked that a <u>statement regarding 300 Nassau Road</u> that she was about to make be given to the district clerk. In the statement Mrs. Black commented on an article in the *Times of Huntington* newspaper entitled "Replacement School Uncool?" (See Attached).

Mr. McGrath commented on the <u>Varsity Wrestling team's</u> success at State Finals. Two students won state titles and a third student finished as a runner up. Huntington finished second overall in New York State scoring. Mr. McGrath said it was an unbelievable effort to get to this level and wanted to recognize the team and the program. It was quite an accomplishment.

PUBLIC COMMENTARY

Mr. Dwyer asked that public commentary in regard to budget issues be held until the budget was discussed later in the meeting. The purpose would be so that the Board of Education could conduct an open forum to have a more interactive budget discussion with the public.

She then announced that OOMPAH for Arts-In-Education had partnered with Book Revue in Huntington Village to present a book signing on Friday, March 5, 2010 at Huntington High School. All were invited to attend the book signing of #1 New York Times bestselling author, Jodi Picoult for her book "House Rules."

Academic Progress

Dr. Card introduced Carmen Kasper, Director of ESL and Bilingual Education who then presented a very extensive review of the departments and programs that she supervises. Discussion followed.

2010-2011 Budget Discussion

Mr. Dwyer indicated that there would be a general overview of the budget and then discussion amongst the Board and the community. Mr. Finello began by saying that administration would present the Board with different budget scenarios and ask direction from the Board as to the target tax rate increase. Extensive discussion followed with much input from the community. The Board agreed to a 3.5 percent tax rate increase.

In the February 11, 2010 Times of Huntington article Replacement School

Uncool?, a resident of the Huntington School District was quoted as saying

"Adding third grade to the current fourth through sixth grade school format

would result in redistricting, which could create a more segregated school

district, he warned... Could it be that the goal of keeping some people's kids out of

school and this neighborhood is the real driving force. I hope not."

I must say that after reading the article I was stunned by the suggestion that was

presented. Our Superintendent, Jay Finello, has openly supported seeking the

purchase of the Toaz School. To assert that there is an ulterior motive on the part

of Mr. Finello, the Administration or the Board of Education, to create segregated

schools by making this purchase, is irresponsible and shameful. We need space

for the education of the children in our District. We are exploring all possibilities

toward achieving this end. In this pursuit, cool and reasonable minds must

prevail. For anyone to take aim or suggest ill thought with this endeavor is

reprehensible. I would ask that everyone be responsible in their thoughts, words

and actions so that the best can be accomplished for our children.
