REGULAR MEETING MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION HUNTINGTON U.F.S.D.

June 7, 2010

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District was held on Monday, June 7, 2010 at Jack Abrams Intermediate School, Lowndes Avenue, Huntington Station, New York. The meeting was called to order at 7:32 p.m.

ROLL CALL

There were present Board of Education Members: Dwyer, Rogan, Benè, Black, Brown, McGrath, Paci; Superintendent Finello, Mr. Grackin, Dr. Giani, Dr. Card and Mrs. Troffa.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Dwyer led the Board of Education and the others present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION PROCEDURE

Mr. Dwyer discussed the exits to be used in the event of any emergency.

SMOKE-FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT

Mr. Dwyer announced that the Huntington Union Free School District is a smoke-free district and smoking is prohibited in all buildings and on school grounds. Mr. Dwyer also requested that all cell phones be turned off or set to vibrate.

COMMUNICATIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mrs. Rogan attended Career Day at Woodhull. She was very impressed with the students and staff and was happy to have participated.

Mrs. Rogan also attended, along with Mr. Dwyer, Mr. Finello and Mrs. Bené, a Huntington Safe and Drug Free Schools program presentation that was very informative and well done. Mrs. Rogan is hoping it can be presented in our schools. Mr. Finello indicated he was planning on doing that.

Mrs. Bené attended a Film Festival at Huntington High School on May 27th. She indicated it was wonderful and so well done and the video can be purchased for \$10. She thanked the students and staff.

Mrs. Black met with a former New York City detective who is part of a company who works with school districts in assessing safety on their premises. The company name is Strategic Protection

Group. Mr. Grackin then indicated that there has been no further information from Federal Shield other than the preliminary report. He also indicated that even though there was initially a financial arrangement made, no payment has been made by the school district. Mrs. Black thought that the district might be interested in working with this company. Mr. Dwyer indicated that we should move forward and look at this organization as well as others.

Mrs. Brown and Mrs. Rogan attended a Code Enforcement Summit headed by Mark Cuthbertson, Town Councilman. Mrs. Brown also updated the board on a meeting she attended of the Economic Development Corporation (EDC) on June 1st at which the Revitalization of Huntington Station was the topic. At this meeting she was appointed as a Director on that Board representing the school district. Mrs. Brown clarified when questioned by Mrs. Black that she is not representing the School Board, but herself as a district resident. She encouraged residents to attend Town meetings indicating that the next Town Board meeting is June 15th.

Dr. Card responded to a petition signed by more than 700 residents asking the district to look at alternative solutions to a 6th grade center. Part of the petition had to do with 5th graders underperforming at Jack Abrams and a comparison made to similar schools. Dr. Card addressed that issue. He explained that we need to be careful when we compare ourselves to other schools in that the comparison may not be fair. The State Education Department recommends that before we compare that we should do a three year trend analysis in our own schools.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION/ACTION

Granting of Tenure

A MOTION was made by Mrs. Black and seconded by Mrs. Rogan to approve Schedule H10.1 through H10.20 on the Personnel Agenda.

MOTION carried.

Dr. Giani then read the names of all staff members who just received tenure and asked them to stand to be recognized and congratulated.

Scholar Artist and Scholar Athlete Awards: Science Research

Mr. Finello introduced Mrs. Fretz who announced the recipients of the Scholar Artist Award. Two of the students were present and Mrs. Fretz introduced them. Mrs. Fretz explained the criteria for receiving this award and congratulated the students on their accomplishments.

Mr. Finello then asked Mrs. McCarthy to announce the two recipients of the Scholar Athlete Awards. One student was present. Mrs. McCarthy listed their accomplishments and introduced the student who was present.

Dr. Card announced the Science Research Awards and recognized David Casamento for his innovative service and leadership throughout the year. He then announced the winners and congratulated them for their accomplishments.

Academic Progress

Mr. Finello introduced Mrs. Fretz who gave an overview of the many accomplishments by Music and Art students and the academic progress in the Performing Arts area. She indicated that Huntington is looked to by other districts as a leader in the arts and explained the reasons for this.

Woodhull Grades 4 & 5, Jack Abrams Grade 6 Presentation

Mr. Finello indicated that since the last board meeting Central Administration personnel has been working on the 4th and 5th grade configuration as well as the 6th Grade Center.

Dr. Card reported on the work he and the building principals have done and the benefits of having all 4th and 5th grades in one facility. The core program will be presented to the Board at the July 6th meeting.

Dr. Giani reported on the current projections and that the consolidation saved two sections. Staff will be reassigned because of the reconfiguration and will be notified early next week. Dr. Giani also reported that there will be no increased cost and staff is currently working on bus routes.

Mr. Grackin distributed a preliminary layout and explained the use of both buildings, Jack Abrams and Woodhull. He explained a change that will be made to the cafeteria at Woodhull in order to make space for a second food line there. Support staff will also be moved from Jack Abrams to Woodhull. He indicated some offices will be moved from the high school to Jack Abrams making more room at Huntington High School. Mr. Grackin also indicated that the CPSE office will be moved from Finley to JAC and the Teacher Center will be moved to the main level at JAC, relocated from the second floor.

There was discussion about the portables and their location at Woodhull, the advantage of having directors at one location, with the exception of Mrs. Fretz and Mrs. McCarthy who have extensive programs at the high school and will not be moved.

Mr. Finello then introduced Jarrett Stein, Principal of Woodhull, who spoke about his school and the great students, staff and parents. He spoke about the motto of dignity and respect that they have at Woodhull and indicated the programs that he has started to help support and nurture the students. He indicated that Woodhull is ready for the change.

Mr. Finello introduced Mary Stokkers, Principal of Jack Abrams, who reported on how JAC is preparing for being a 6th Grade Center. Tours are being given for 4th graders and next Monday 5th graders who will be coming from Woodhull will be touring the building. Mrs. Stokkers indicated that staff is working together in planning for the change.

Architects' Report

Mr. Finello introduced Roger Smith, architect from Burton Behrendt Smith, the district's architect, who presented some ideas to be considered in both short term and long term planning. He

suggested that there be an Advisory Committee that would work through the different ideas and make a recommendation to the Board of Education. A schedule of committee meeting dates and proposed goals was discussed. He discussed the possibility of a bond issue to be voted on possibly in December and the timeline for that.

A MOTION was made by Mr. Dwyer and seconded by Mrs. Brown to form a long term building planning committee. There was discussion about the number of committee members and how to choose them. It was decided that the configuration of the voting members of the Committee would be as follows:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District desires to embark upon capital improvement projects at various district schools as follows:

Installation of Modular Classrooms at Woodhull Intermediate School

Whereas, said capital improvement projects at the above schools are subject to classification under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA); and

Whereas, replacement, rehabilitation, and reconstruction of a structure or facility, in kind on the same site, including upgrading building to meet building or fire codes and routine activities of educational institutions, including expansion of existing facilities by less than 10,000 square feet of gross floor area, are classified as Type II under the current Department of Environmental Conservation SEQRA Regulation (Section 6 NYCRR 617.5 (c)(2); and

WHEREAS, the SEQRA declare Type II Actions to be actions that have no significant impact on the environment and require no further review under SEQRA;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District declares itself as lead agency for the proposed capital improvement project and has examined all information related to the capital improvement projects and has determined that the capital improvement projects at Woodhull Intermediate School are classified as Type II Action pursuant to Section 617.5 (c)(2) of the SEQRA regulations.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE PAYMENT RESERVE FUND

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District has elected to become liable for payments in lieu of contributions required of employers liable for contributions under Article 18 of the Labor Law; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District had previously established a reserve fund entitled the Unemployment Insurance Payment Reserve Fund; and

WHEREAS, the District's external auditor has recommended that the Board of Education readopt the resolution establishing the Unemployment Insurance Payment Reserve Fund

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District, pursuant to Section 6-m of the General Municipal Law, as follows:

- 1. The Board hereby establishes a Reserve Fund to be known as the Huntington Union Free School District Unemployment Insurance Payment Reserve Fund;
- 2. The source of funds for this Reserve Fund shall be:
 - a. such amounts as may be provided therefore by budgetary appropriations;
 - b. amounts from any other fund authorized by the General Municipal Law, by resolution subject to permissive referendum; and
 - c. such other funds as may be legally appropriated;
- 3. An expenditure shall be made from this fund only as required by law to pay into the unemployment insurance fund an amount equivalent to the amount of benefits paid to claimants and charged to the account of the District in accordance with Section 581(1)(e) of the Labor Law.
- 4. The moneys in this Reserve Fund shall be deposited and secured in the manner provided by Section 10 of the General Municipal Law. The Board of Education or its authorized designee may invest the moneys in this Reserve Fund in the manner provided in Section 11 of the General Municipal Law. Any interest earned or capital gain realized on the money so deposited or invested shall accrue to and become part of the Reserve Fund. The separate identity of this Reserve Fund shall be maintained whether its assets consist of cash or investments or both.
- 5. If at the end of any fiscal year the moneys in this Reserve Fund shall exceed the amounts required to be paid pursuant to Section 6-m(4) of the General Municipal Law, plus any additional amount required to pay all pending claims, the Board of Education may, within sixty (60) days of the close of such fiscal year, elect to:
 - a. transfer said excess, or any part thereof, to any fund authorized by Article 2 of the General Municipal Law or Section 3651 of the Education Law; and/or
 - b. apply said excess, or any part thereof to the budget appropriation of the next succeeding fiscal year.
- 6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
